Robogals

Robogals is an international, not-for-profit organisation that aims to inspire, engage and empower young women into engineering and related fields. This is achieved through fun and educational initiatives aimed at girls in primary and secondary school. Since its inception in 2008, Robogals has engaged over 59,000 girls around the world.

The Role

Robogals EMEA is seeking a new Regional Mentor to support the growth of the EMEA region and lead the EMEA regional team. Candidates will have a passion for inspiring girls and women about careers in engineering and building a culture of diversity and inclusion in engineering.

In the EMEA Region we currently have 13 chapters, each of which is tied to a university. As a regional mentor your role would be to support and offer guidance to a subset of these chapters. This would involve meeting with them over Skype/Google Hangouts once a month and being on hand to answer questions and offer advice. You would also be their representative at a Regional Level. This requires you to provide feedback on how chapters are doing, any queries they may have and what support you think they need from the organisation in order to succeed.

You would be part of the EMEA regional team. This is a remote team but you would be in regular contact with members of the team. Any individual taking up the role has a great opportunity to meet like minded people who are passionate about improving diversity in STEM.

The Regional Mentor's responsibilities will include:

- Liaising between chapters and the regional team and represent their interests
- Meeting with other regional mentors to share ideas of mentoring and chapter advice
- Offer advice and support to the chapters
- Assist new chapters in setting up

Application Process

This is an unpaid voluntary role, we are looking for someone who can commit roughly 3-5 hours a week and is enthusiastic and eager to learn new things. This role is open to all genders. If you are interested in applying, please contact ami@robogals.org.
